Meteoric Resources

At least 12 new areas of gold mineralisation have been revealed by drilling at the Harrod project, located 20km from the Fortnum gold mine in Western Australia. Meteoric Resources (MEI) reported that a 100-hole drilling program had produced grades of up to 35.9g a tonne over 1m. Other intersections included 5m at 4.23g/t and 3m at 3.84g/t. The 35.9g/t hit was at the end of the hole and the mineralisation was open below and to the north. Meteoric said it was aiming to delineate a large resource at its Wilthorpe project, of which the Harrod tenements are part, and the ground had some geological similarity to the two million ounce Callie deposit in the Tanami region of the Northern Territory.
